



HOW MUCH IS THE TUITION FEE?

6,000 EUR per year for the BECES, CECS, ES and TS programmes.

9,000 EUR per year for IMESS students from the EU, including EEA-EFTA.

15,500 EUR per year for IMESS students from outside of the EU, including EE-EFTA.

ANY SCHOLARSHIP POSSIBILITIES?

FSV UK directly administers university scholarships for students from developing and transition countries. These scholarships offer students a 50% waiver of school fees and a one-off lump sum payment towards living costs. Students can also apply for scholarships NOT administered by FSV UK.

HOW TO APPLY?

Go to www.fsv.cuni.cz and apply online. The early admissions deadline is the end of February; the regular deadline is 30th April of each year.

All applications must include:

- a complete application form
- copies of all relevant diplomas and transcripts
- a short academic resume detailing all relevant qualifications and experience
- details of any tests of English proficiency (if you are not a native speaker)

CHOOSE YOUR PROGRAMME:

BALKAN, EURASIAN AND CENTRAL EUROPEAN STUDIES (BECES)

BECES focuses on modern history, politics and diplomacy, as well as fundamental social, cultural and economic issues. You will get a chance to explore "the East", understood as the territory composed of Central Europe, the Balkan Peninsula, and the Post-Soviet area, including the Caucasus and Central Asia. After completion of BECES, you will have acquired an advanced level of graduate education including a good command of one or two of the languages of the area as well as a broad and deep knowledge of the region studied.

You will have the opportunity to continue your self-education and to find positions related to the issues in the studied area in both the public and private spheres.

CENTRAL EUROPEAN COMPARATIVE STUDIES (CECS)

The programme specializes in the areas of Germany, Austria and the Visegrad Countries (the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Poland and Hungary) with an overlap into neighbouring regions. It offers a thorough comparative and multidisciplinary understanding of the historical, political, economic and cultural developments of these countries. You will focus on comparative analysis of political systems in the 20th century, political development since 1990, the economies, European integration, culture, and the history of society in the 19th and 20th centuries.

Graduates of CECS are most likely to emerge as regional analysts, diplomats, high level civil servants, employees of European institutions or territorial experts and will possess an advanced knowledge of German and a basic knowledge of at least one Central European language.

EUROPEAN STUDIES (ES)

ES aims at providing students with a complex and in-depth understanding of the European integration process in its broader historical and political context. You will study the territory of Europe and the European integration process in all its complexity and variety. The programme deals not only with individual European countries, the member states of the EU and its regions, but also with the European integration process, focusing mainly on its current development influenced by two features: enlargement and the deepening of the European integration process.

Graduates will have opportunities to become highly-skilled employees in the civil service and diplomatic representations, in the EU institutions as well as in other international organizations, private companies and the media.

TRANSATLANTIC STUDIES (TS)

TS provides students with deep, interdisciplinary knowledge of transatlantic relations since 1945 from a Central European perspective. Close attention is paid to history, politics, and diplomacy so that students can understand the changing nature of transatlantic relations during the different phases of the Cold War and afterward. You will gain a balanced, well-rounded appreciation of the complex nature of transatlantic studies. You will study in post-Cold War Europe in a country which overcame Soviet subjugation to become a full member of NATO and the EU.

After finishing the programme, opportunities include the diplomatic or civil service in your home country, employment in international organizations, the private sector and the growing NGO sector.

INTERNATIONAL MASTERS IN ECONOMY, STATE AND SOCIETY (IMESS)

IMESS is the leading programme in comparative area studies. It will help you to develop in-depth knowledge and understanding of Central, Eastern and South-Eastern Europe, the Baltics, Russia, the Caucasus and Central Asia. In your first year you will study at the School of Slavonic and East European Studies, University College London (UCL), the coordinating university which is listed among the top twenty global universities, and you will spend your second year at Charles University.

You will be well prepared for positions in distinguished private and public sector organisations or you can continue with doctoral studies.
